ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Admission to OLMA is competitive and students are evaluated based upon five areas: application with essay; letters of recommendation; transcript; entrance exam; and interview. Our Lady of Mercy Academy offers college prep, honors, and AP courses. Students have the option to enroll in AP courses starting sophomore year. Dual credit is also available through various community colleges

Students take seven academic courses per year, including:

Theology: 4 years (20)	Science (2 years w/ a lab): 3 years (15)
History: 3 years (15)	Mathematics: 4 years (20)
English: 4 years (20)	Foreign Language: 2 years (10)
Electives (up to 25)	Leadership: 2 years (10)

Leadership I & II: These courses are designed to support positive leadership growth and development and provide a dedicated learning environment for practicing bravery in the face of fear.

Students also enroll in two Innovation Blocks (iBlocks) every year and one Mini-Mester their freshman, sophomore, and junior years.

Innovation Blocks: The iBlock encourages students to explore new interests and embrace the possibilities of creativity, providing opportunities to celebrate the arts. These courses are OLMA's version of clubs. Sample iBlocks listed on the next page.

Mini-Mester Courses: Through a week-long experiential learning program, the OLMA Mini-Mester delivers a wide variety of experiences and learning opportunities. A complete catalog of available Mini-Mester courses is provided to students each year. Students are required to take at least one service Mini-Mester. Examples include:

Italy - history, architecture, and cuisine Hands to Work - service immersion

Costa Rica - wellness, yoga, and surfing retreat Culinary Arts - kitchen safety, baking and cooking

Graduation Requirements: A minimum of 125 total credits are required for graduation. For a student to graduate, she must complete and pass all required courses.

Leadership

OLMA offers various leadership development programs that may include workshops, seminars, training sessions, and team-building exercises.

Student Leadership Council

The Student Leadership Council, in coordination with Class Representatives, is composed of elected student leaders and serves as a platform for student representation, voice and involvement in school-related decisions and initiatives.

Music Ministry

The Music Ministry enriches our spiritual life through music. Students in this group lead worship during prayer services and Mass, using their voices and instruments to inspire and support our community. This group plays a key role in fostering a deeper connection through the power of music.

GUIDANCE CURRICULUM

Our guidance curriculum begins with classroom instruction starting freshman year on creating useful study habits.

Sophomores participate in a 6-week career exploratory program focused on career inventories and education on career pathways.

Junior guidance class focuses on resume building and interview preparation. Juniors also partake in Mock Interview Day with professionals in the working field. Junior and senior classes focus heavily on college planning. They also participate in Job Shadow Day, where they have the opportunity to learn about a given career off-campus. Options include but are not limited to hospitals, business offices, doctor offices, architects and engineering sites.

A Career Day is hosted for grades 9-11, bringing in over 20 professionals from a variety of fields. A college fair is hosted for grades 11-12, bringing in 40 colleges/universities.
